### Directions to Guygirri Country Retreat

No matter where you live you need to get on to the M5 Freeway and head South West

Please Note: The retreat is not available on [whereis.com.au](http://whereis.com.au) or a GPS

**Coming from:**

- Sydney City, Eastern or Inner Southern Suburbs – Join M5 East / Airport Freeway and onto M5 main tunnel; M5 to Hume Highway
- Inner North & Lower North Shore – Take Harbour Tunnel and join M5 East
- Upper North Shore & Northern Beaches – Join M2 at Mona Vale Road, East Ryde. M2 joins M7 joins M5 / Hume Highway  
Or take Mona Vale Road / Homebush Bay Drive / King Georges Road to M5 turning right at Roselands
- North West – Pennant Hills Road, Windsor Road, M2, M7 to M5
- West – M7 to M5 or Seven Hills, Quakers Hill, Rooty Hill join M7 to M5 or Northern Road to Narellan, Narellan Road to Camden Bypass

**Directions:**

From the M5 (which becomes the F5 / Hume Highway near Liverpool) take the Narellan Road exit on your left (which is the 2nd Campbelltown exit) heading towards Camden / Campbelltown / Appin.

The Narellan Road exit will ‘fork’ left and right, be sure to stay in the right lane of the exit and head to Camden/Narellan – the exit road merges with Narellan Road travelling west toward Narellan and Camden.

You will pass five sets of traffic lights and then swing left onto the Camden Bypass, which is the Old Hume Highway / Remembrance Drive.

Follow this road for approx 17km (You will travel over the Nepean River Bridge), through South Camden, continue along Remembrance Drive following the Picton signs.

You will start to travel up Razorback Mountain and just beyond a sign which simply says ‘Razorback Range’ is Donald’s Range Road on your left – it is opposite the Razorback Lookout on your right.

Turn left into Donald’s Range Road and travel 2 kms.

The street number (210) is clearly marked on the fence and is on your right.

- The 1860's Tollgate Lodge - a delightful cottage, once the home of the toll collector on the Great Southern Road
- The Imperial Hotel - built in the 1860's
- "Jarvisfield" - the historic home of the Antill family, the original owners of Picton (02) 4677 2044
